National Competitiveness Center receives Makkah Excellence Award







The National Competitiveness Center received Makkah Excellence Award in its economic branch, which is given to distinguish entities or individuals in activating economic development. NCC received this award for its efforts that resulted in the Kingdom being ranked first in the world in "Doing Business 2020" report.

The award encourages winners from

government, private, or non-profit organizations to set a good example in society, which will positively reflects on national enterprises. In addition to promote innovation by providing a platform to exchange successful experiences between different business sectors. Moreover, to learn about the best practices, and activating the participation of establishments in building society and promoting sustainability in all fields.



The National Competitiveness Center (TAYSEER), in cooperation with the General Commission for Audiovisual Media, organized a virtual workshop on the media law project, with the participation of more than 160 people, including specialists, media professionals, academics and investors in the media sector.

The participants stressed on the importance of such workshops to express their views on regulations and bylaws projects, and activate the role of the Laws and Regulations Support Unit in the governance of the survey process in the Kingdom.

The discussions focused on the importance of observing and protecting the rights of

the child and the family in the new law. As well as the intellectual in media, and the governance of the committees specialized in looking into violations of the law. In addition to media licenses classifications clarity and their relevance to social media influencers.

The participants' recommendations included that the law must cover more number of licensing provisions to ensure the comprehensiveness of organizing the media professions and reviewing and codifying the competencies granted to the Board of Directors of the General Commission for Audiovisual Media. In addition to a suggestion that the authority to close electronic newspapers be pursuant to a court ruling.

Virtual Meeting to Review Safety Achievements and Receives Investors' Feedback





The National Competitiveness Center (TAYSEER) held a remote meeting with the Assistant Director General of Civil Defense for Safety, Major General Khalid Al-Oudah, in the presence of the Assistant Minister of Commerce, CEO of the National Competitiveness Center, Dr. Eiman Al-Mutairi. The meeting was in cooperation with the Council of Saudi Chambers to review the most prominent safety achievements to improve the investors' experience.

The meeting discussed the approved new regulations and legislations, and the General

Directorate of Civil Defense initiatives to improve the business environment in the Kingdom. In addition to the new Civil Defense law and its relevance to investors, developing Civil Defense electronic services, and raising the level of public safety. The meeting also discussed the immediate permits for construction and their relevance to safety services, answering investors' inquiries and questions, and reviewing their views and feedback on future development operations.

The National Competitiveness Center (TAYSEER), through Laws and Regulations Support Unit electronic platform, received public consultations on more than 20 projects of laws and regulations, and the rules and decisions proposed by various government entities. That was by preparing survey forms and collocate notes on laws and regulations projects related to economic and development affairs in the Kingdom, by preparing the poll models to evaluate their impacts, and circulating it to government entities.

In addition to organize working sessions, training courses, meetings, seminars and conferences specialized in raising awareness, and spreading the culture of public consultations and the importance of participating in evaluating the organizational impacts on projects of laws and regulations, and similar. These regulations included a regulation law project for protecting confidential commercial information, the law project for regulating the rules of liberal professions, consumer protection policy in gyms and sports centers, licensing private sports clubs, licensing sports academies, licensing private gyms. In addition to the law project for amending the information and documents list submitted by the bankruptcy committee, digital transaction and trust law project, water law executive regulations project, the law project regulations for the requirements of sewing shops and the law project regulations for the requirements of laundry and dry cleaning shops.

The bylaws and regulations put forward for a public consultation also included a draft model form for opening a bank account (legal persons), a draft model form for opening a bank account (individuals), the law project for the agricultural development fund. Moreover, the law project for amending the information and documents list, and the electronic billing law project.

This mechanism aims to activate communication between government entities and sectors and the private sector to answer inquiries, while restricting opinions on law and regulations projects in order to develop dealing with challenges and identifying appropriate reforms to address them. In addition to improve the competitiveness environment in economic sectors, spreading the culture of surveying about law and regulations projects, and enhancing their application.
